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
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## ADULT EDUCATION

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### BISHOP JACK SPONG ON THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW

*Sunday mornings at 9:00 am in the Parish Hall*



Join us for Bishop Spong's engaging series on the Gospel of Matthew, lectures taken from his upcoming book. The lectures will begin promptly at 9:00 am in the Parish Hall—come early and grab a cup of coffee!

- October 4<sup>th</sup>      Separating Matthew's Gospel from the Rest of the New Testament  
*How many people know that Matthew is the first Gospel writer to introduce the Virgin Birth into the Christian story and that he did it in the 9th decade of the Christian era, circa 85CE?*
- October 11<sup>th</sup>     Matthew's Dependency on Mark: A Hidden Liturgical Connection  
*How many people know that Matthew not only copied 90% of Mark (written circa 72CE) into his Gospel, but he also expanded Mark by another 40%? What did he add and why?*
- October 18<sup>th</sup>     The Shadow of Moses in the Gospel of Matthew  
*How many people know that the story of Herod slaughtering the innocent baby boys in Bethlehem, the narrative of Jesus feeding the multitudes in the wilderness, the story of Jesus walking on the waters are all Moses stories being re-told about Jesus?*
- November 1<sup>st</sup>     The Story of the Transfiguration of Jesus  
*How many people know that this narrative was a Dedication-Hanukkah story in which Jesus replaces the Temple, which had been destroyed by the Roman Army in 70CE? That was two years before Mark wrote and 10-15 years before Matthew wrote.*

*Note:* On Sunday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, The Rt. Rev. Mark Beckwith, current Bishop of Newark, will be present with us. Watch for more details about the schedule for that day.

Want to get involved, but don't know what's needed? Here are just some of the ways you can participate in the ministry and work here at St. Peter's.





## CHORAL EVENSONG



Join us on Wednesdays, beginning October 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm, for Choral Evensong in the Church. Each week, the service will be followed by a wonderful dinner in the Parish Hall prepared by Brian Bernat, and a class on the Holy Spirit led by Janet Broderick. Sung by the Choristers of St. Peter's Church and an ATB Schola, this brief service features some of the most beautiful music ever written. Often referred to as the "Crown Jewel of Anglican liturgies," Evensong offers a chance to worship in a different way than Sunday morning, participating through active and prayerful listening as the choir sings much of the service. The service consists of psalms, readings, canticles, an anthem, and prayers for the Church, the world, and those in need. These promise to be wonderful evenings of worship, fellowship, and teaching.

Children outside of the district can attend but must be dropped off. Our skilled tutors are ready to help your children in whatever subjects they find challenging. Science projects, book reports, no problem – we can handle them all! Are some of those new math terms challenging even the brightest and best parents out there? No problem – we have it covered! We also have 15 computers connected to the Internet and ready to go, so online assignments can be completed on time and with ease.

# STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry is a Christian caring ministry in which clergy and laity work together to provide quality one-to-one care. The mission of Stephen Ministry is to show the love of Jesus Christ through people. The name comes from Acts 6:1-7 where Stephen is identified as one of the first lay people set aside to do caring ministry.



Stephen Ministers are laypeople trained to provide one-to-one care to people experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, relocation, difficult pregnancy, problems supporting others who are ill or incapacitated, spiritual crisis or to those simply needing the support of a Christian friend.

Stephen Ministers receive over 50 hours of initial training in the theology of caring and in specific caring skills such as listening. Stephen Ministers typically meet with the people they are caring for weekly for an hour to provide regular, dependable, empathetic and confidential care. Relationships can last anywhere from a few weeks to a year or two – as long as you need.


I never had a Stephen Minister, but knowing what I know now about them, I wish I had had one. When my parents were ill – my father had a debilitating stroke and my mother was in the psychiatric hospital for weeks at a time from depression – I would have loved to be able to unburden myself with someone outside the family about my frustrations, fears and guilt about being so far away.
